Praemium Imperiale award laureate, Dominique Perrault gained an international recognition with the French National library (1995). This project marked the starting point of many other commissions abroad, such as The Velodrome and Olympic swimming pool of Berlin (1999), the extensions of the European Court of Justice in Luxembourg (2008 and 2019), the campus of Ewha's University in Seoul (2008), or the DC Tower in Vienna (2014). The studio has also carried out various heritage conversion projects, such as the redevelopment of the Pavillon Dufour at the Château de Versailles (2016), the transformation of the Paris Longchamp racecourse (2018), the transformation of the Poste du Louvre in Paris (2021) or the refurbishment of Métal 57 in Boulogne-Billancourt (2022). Combining the scale of the city and that of architecture in an inseparable way, also affirming the proximity between town planning and political vision, each project is an opportunity to establish a prospective, strategic and humanistic vision, beyond a single programmatic issue. His work received prestigious distinctions such as the Mies van der Rohe Pavilion Award in 1997, the World Architecture Award in 2002, the "Seoul Metropolitan Award" for the women University of Ewha in 2008, or the Gold Medal of Architecture from the French Academy of Architecture in 2010. Dominique Perrault is also the founder of DPAX, a multidisciplinary research platform exploring the new perspectives for an underground architecture. Current studies and projects include the DC Tower II in Vienna, the Olympic and Paralympic Athletes Village – Paris 2024, the Gangnam International Transit Center in Seoul, Korea, the new Villejuif-IGR station of the Grand Paris Express public transport network, and the new retractable roof on the Suzanne Lenglen Tennis court, on the French Open site. Jeremy, an economist by training, leads the commercial side of hyperTunnel, bringing his experience as a business owner and entrepreneur in the property and renewable energy sectors, following FMCG global, regional, and country leadership GM roles with two FTSE 10 multinationals (BAT and SABMiller) and Smith & Williamson across four regions and forty countries.
